# Garbage and Bulk

NOTE: All household garbage MUST be placed in garbage bags. DO NOT just place loose garbage directly into the can OR left loose on top of the can

### **Bulk Collection**

Residents must call at least 24 hours in advance from their scheduled bulk pick up day.

Contact the Service Department at 732-364-7500.

Bulk collection consists of furniture and miscellaneous items.

Waste Management will not pick up metal, concrete, stone (statues, granite countertops), or electronics (TVs, computers, radios, etc.). Inform Maintenance what type of items you are putting out for pick-up.

Large amounts of bulk or items left on move outs will be subject to a fee payable by owner. Any garbage/debris from a renovation must be removed by the owner or contractor. Waste Management will not pick up garbage/debris from a renovation.



### LEISURE VILLAGE ASSOCIATION BOARD OF TRUSTEES RESOLUTION NO. 2025-04-03-01

#### RELATING TO MULCH

WHEREAS, this Resolution made this 3rd day of April, 2025, by Leisure Village Association, Inc., a non-profit corporation located in the Township of Lakewood, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey.

WHEREAS, by Master Deed and Declaration of Restrictive and Protective Covenants dated January 29, 1964 in the Ocean County Register's Office, in Deed Book 2368, Page 138, et. seq., as amended, Leisure Village Association, Inc. (hereinafter "the Association") has been established upon certain lands in the Township of Lakewood, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 46:8B-1, et. seq.,; and

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 10 of the Association's By-Laws provides that "the Board of Trustees shall have and exercise all lawful powers and duties necessary for the proper conduct and administration of the affairs of the Association and the operation and maintenance of the Condominiums, and may do or cause to be done all such other lawful acts and things as are not by law, by these Bylaws or otherwise directed or required to be done or exercised by members of the Association or by the co-owners of family units or by others."; and

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 10(m) of the Association's By-Laws provides that the Association shall have the power "to make and enforce compliance with such reasonable rules and regulations relative to the operation, use and occupancy of the family units, common elements, and Association facilities, to include the ability to impose monetary fines and/or suspend privileges, and to amend the same from time to time as the Board shall deem necessary or appropriate, which rules and regulations when approved by appropriate resolutions shall be binding on the co-owners and occupants of family units, their successors in the title, and assigns."; and

WHEREAS, the Association is vested with the authority to adopt reasonable rules and regulations regarding the use and occupancy of the family units and common elements, including the use of mulch around buildings located within the Association; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Fire Code has been modified to require at least 18 inches of space separating mulch beds from combustible building materials; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees believes it is in the best interest of the Association to add this Resolution in an effort to reduce potential fire hazards in the Association.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the following Resolution related to mulch is hereby adopted:

- I. No Unit Owner and/or tenant shall be permitted to install mulch and/or any other combustible material of any kind anywhere on the Association's general and/or limited common elements, which shall include the area within three feet of each building that the Unit Owner is otherwise responsible for.
- II. The use of non-combustible materials such as gravel and stones shall be permitted.
- III. This Resolution shall not prevent the Association from using mulch as it deems appropriate.
- IV. The Association shall levy the following fines and penalties to Unit Owners for non-compliance by them and/or their tenants, which shall be collectable in the same manner as regular assessments:
  - a. <u>First (1st) Offense</u>: A fine in the total amount of one hundred and fifty (\$150.00) dollars shall be assessed and the Owner shall be provided fourteen (14) days to abate the violation.
  - b. <u>Second (2nd) Offense/Failure to Correct</u>: A fine in the total amount of three hundred (\$300.00) dollars and suspension of privileges until compliance is achieved.
  - c. Notwithstanding the fines as provided in Section III (a) and III (b), the Association reserves the right to remove any mulch installed in violation of this Resolution and charge back the costs to the unit owners.
- V. This Resolution shall go into effect April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2025 and members shall have until June 1, 2025 to comply with this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was adopted by the Board of Trustees of Leisure Village Association at its meeting on April 3, 2025.

**NOTICE.** The Association's managing agent is authorized and directed to prepare correspondence, in appropriate form and substance, and thereafter circulate same, along with a copy of this Resolution, to all Owners.

# Special Assessment Information

The Board of Trustees passed Resolution 2025-03-13-01 amending the 2025 Fiscal Operating Income and Expense Budget. As discussed during the recent Open Meeting, this update is due to significant insurance premiums over the amount previously utilized in the Budget.

The Board of Trustees believes that adequately funding the Village is necessary and in the best interest of the Association.

The total amount to be assessed shall be \$352.00 per unit, payable by April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025. Owners had the option to pay the full amount in one payment which had the April 1<sup>st</sup> due date or to pay in two installments. The first payment of \$176 was due on April 1<sup>st</sup> and the second payment of \$176 due on May 1<sup>st</sup>.

# Fishing and Boating Rules



Lake Victoria will be open for catch and keep fishing. This is in effect for 2025. All other lakes are catch and release. Remember, you must have your valid NJ freshwater fishing license and LVA ID badge with you. Please refer to the 2019 Rules & Regulations Handbook for all Fishing Rules (page 40).

When a resident or a resident's guest wishes to use the rowboats, the resident will contact the custodian on duty at Buckingham Hall. If the custodian can't be reached, you may contact LVA Boats at (732) 597-4485 or Gate 1 at (732) 363-4506. The resident must sign the boat out and acknowledge awareness of compliance with all fishing and boating rules. They can be used from the hours of 7:00 a.m. until dusk on Lake Waddill. Guests under 6 years of age are not permitted and guests must be 16 years of age or older to take a boat out. No more than four people per boat – all must wear a personal floatation device. Once you return, the boat must be signed back in. Remember, you must have your ID badge with you. Boats will not be available on official OLV holidays. Refer to the 2019 Rules & Regulations Handbook for all Boating Regulations (page 41).

# **2025 Pool Rules**

Residents and guests swim at their own risk and only during posted hours.

There will be no lifeguards on duty. Bathers should not swim alone.

Children must not use the pool without adult supervision.

- 1. Residents are required to scan their badges to enter pool areas. Badges are not to be worn in the pools.
- 2. Private employees such as private duty nurses, housekeepers, etc., are not permitted to use a resident's badge for access to the pools. These employees shall wear a guest badge and be accompanied by a resident.
- 3. All guests MUST sign the registration book when entering the pool areas. Unless using a Pool Smartcard, guests must be accompanied by a resident member.
- 4. All persons entering the water must wear acceptable bathing attire. No cut-off jeans are permitted in the pool. A covering wrap is recommended outside the fenced pool areas.
- 5. Before entering a pool, it is suggested that a shower be taken in the bathhouse.
- 6. No person with a communicable disease, bandages, Band-Aids, or absorbent undergarment may enter the pools.
- 7. ONLY WEARABLE U.S. COAST GUARD APPROVED LIFE JACKETS, SWIM AIDS AND EYE PROTECTION ARE ALLOWED IN THE POOL. No other floatation devices, scuba equipment or toys of any kind are permitted (Pool Noodles are permitted).
- 8. Bicycles and pets are not permitted within the fenced pool areas. An infant in a carriage, stroller or playpen is permitted in the areas during the children's swimming hours only, but not in the pools at any time.
- 9. Alcoholic beverages are not permitted in the fenced pool areas. All other beverages must be in plastic containers or thermoses. Food is allowed, but all trash must be deposited in trash cans and tables made clean for others to use.
- 10. No child under the age of 3 years and/or still wearing diapers may enter the pools at any time. Children, ages 3 years to 15 years inclusive, may use pools and fenced pool areas only during children's hours and must be accompanied by a parent or resident member who will be solely responsible for them. Children between the ages of 3 and 5 must have an adult with them in the water.

Children's Hours: 10:00 AM to Noon daily at Buckingham Pool

1:00 PM to 3:00 PM daily at Dorchester Pool

### \*\*If one pool is closed for any reason, both Children's Hours will be honored at the other pool \*\*

- 11. A swim committee member on duty has the authority to enforce the rules pertaining to use of the swimming pools and the pool areas. No yelling, fighting or abusive language towards a swim committee member or other residents will not be tolerated.
- 12. In the event of bad weather or unsafe conditions, the pools may be closed.

## **MULCH**

As discussed in the recent Open Meeting, a new state law went into effect on April 15<sup>th</sup> regarding the use of mulch for all multiple dwellings, as well as businesses, hotels and restaurants. The regulations require that a minimum of 18 inches of space separate mulch beds from combustible building materials.

The Board of Trustees has discussed the removal of mulch in the 3-foot areas, its safety and compliance, and potential future positive impact on insurance. As of June 1st, mulch must be removed from all 3-foot areas within the Village. When removing mulch from your unit, you may place the mulch in garbage bags out by your curb for proper disposal. Please contact the Service Department of their placement and our staff will remove the bags from your curb. If you are using a contractor to remove the mulch, don't forget your permit, and they must dispose of the mulch. The Village will only be picking up bags that the residents have filled. If you are replacing mulch with a non-combustible material, you must complete a permit. Thank you all for your cooperation.

### **Permits**

All interior and exterior changes (including your 3' foot area) require an approved Leisure Village Permit Application before work can begin. Submit your completed permit application in Administration or drop off in the Receptionist mailbox in our lobby. Permits must be submitted by close of business on Tuesdays each week in order to be considered for review by Management and then forwarded to the Board of Trustees on Thursdays. As a reminder, if your permit is for exterior work, three (3) neighboring residents approval signatures and unit numbers must be provided. The approval process could take up to two weeks.

If you have an outside contractor performing work in your home, please have him/her dispose of the debris after completing the job. Leisure Village <u>WILL NOT</u> pick up anything left by a contractor.

Additionally, all lawns are considered common grounds and are owned and maintained by the Village. Placement of any objects in the common areas must also receive prior approval. A permit must be completed and approved for any items on common ground.

Remember: The application must be approved by the Association prior to performing any work. Thank you!

"All owners should be aware that no work which in any way alters the internal structure or external appearance of any unit or its immediate surroundings shall be done without an approved OLV permit in addition to permits obtained from the Township of Lakewood, as they require. Any violation of the above will result in remediation at the owner's expense and/or an assessed fine." From the Rules & Regulations 2019 Handbook (Page 54).

### **GARBAGE COLLECTION REMINDER**

Residents residing in units where their garbage receptacle does not face a roadway will be asked to place the garbage on top of the inground receptacle or at the end of your walkway on your designated collection day.



## **Grilling Rules**

As Spring arrives and temperatures begin to warm, we are reminded of our favorite outdoor activities. We think about great meals cooked on our grills which have been tucked away for the Winter. Here are the grill reminders:

Charcoal, electric and propane grills are permitted in the Village, when used properly. All grills, when being used, must be a minimum of 5 feet away from combustible construction such as soffits or walls.

Propane grills have special rules, based on local fire codes for multiple dwellings and Village rules. If you are in violation of any of the following rules, there will be significant fines accessed against you by the NJ Fire Marshall and/or OLV:

- A Leisure Village permit and approval of Design Committee is required for placement of grill;
- Propane grills and tanks must be kept at all times a minimum of 5 feet out from combustible construction
- If you do not have a patio to accommodate requirements, you must create at least a 4'x4' paver area, at least 5 feet out from combustible construction;
- At no time can propane tanks be stored within residences, garages, carports, storage areas, or within 5 feet of any combustible construction.

Working chimineas, firepits, and tiki torches are not permitted!

### **Vehicle Registrations**

If you registered your vehicle with the Administration Office with a temporary registration, we must have a copy of your new vehicle registration once you receive it. Please submit a copy of your new vehicle registration to Administration@leisurevillagenj.com or drop off in the Receptionist Mailbox in our lobby to be processed. If you do not furnish updated vehicle registration, your barcode will temporarily deactivate when the temporary registration expires.



### **Welcome Back, Snowbirds!**

Now that you have returned to the Village, please contact the Administration Office so your mailing address can be updated. This will prevent you from not receiving notices or other mailings, as well as keeping them from being sent & returned, and reducing unnecessary postage costs. Additionally, double check your visitors list to make sure all of your visitors are listed. You can email us: <a href="mailto:Administration@leisurevillagenj.com">Administration@leisurevillagenj.com</a> or call us to inform us when you return to the Village.



### **Temporary Parking Passes**



All residents are responsible for obtaining an overnight parking pass for their overnight guests at the Administration Building or at Gate 1. This pass must be displayed at all times inside the front window of the guest's vehicle. Temporary Overnight Parking Passes will be issued for up to two weeks (thru Admin only). If needed, it can be reissued for an additional two-week period (30 day maximum). Also, please remember to update your visitors list with the Administration Office or you can do it yourself with your ISN Portal.

(Rules and Regulations - p. 9):

### **GUESTS AND TEMPORARY RESIDENTS:**

- 1. No guest shall reside in a unit for more than 30 days, in any 45-day period. Anyone residing over 30 days must register as a temporary or permanent resident at the Administration Office, Monday through Friday, by appointment only. Non-registration, as required, will subject the owner to a fine for each day not registered.
- 2 In any 12-month period, temporary residency shall not exceed six months (including time spent as guest), as provided by the Master Deed.
- 3. A guest or temporary resident shall not reside therein unless the owner, qualified lessee, or qualified occupant who is 55 years or older is currently residing therein.
- 4. All residents are responsible for obtaining an overnight parking pass for their overnight guests at the Administration Building, or at Gate 1. This pass must be displayed at all times inside the front window of the guest's vehicle.

### **Air Conditioning Units**

As the warmer weather is coming, don't forget to test your AC unit. It's easy to test your AC unit. On a warm day, turn your unit on. If it's not running cold, try to replace the filter. If it is still not running cold after you replace the filter, or you are unsure how to do this, call the Maintenance Department at (732) 364-7500, and ask them to come look at it. When the warm weather arrives, you want to be ready.

If the need arises to replace your central air conditioning unit, don't forget to obtain both your Leisure Village and Lakewood Permits.

Leisure Village Association units were initially built with central or thru-wall air conditioning systems. As owners are looking to replace their older systems, they may have thought about substituting their systems with temporary window air conditioning units. Window air conditioning units. Window air conditioning units are not permitted in Leisure Village Association.

For those looking to replace their central systems with lesser expensive options, there are a few. There are various types of portable air conditioning units that adhere to the Rules and Regulations of Leisure Village Association.

## **Smart Cards**

It's Pool Time!! That means if you haven't seen your smart card in some time, it is a great time to look for it. If you have searched and still cannot find your smart card, don't wait to too long to get a new one – schedule your appointment to pick it up. The replacement cost is \$15. If you were searching for yours and found two, please contact Administration We had likely had previously issued you a replacement for a lost smart card – that means only one is a valid smart card. If you bring the invalid smart card, you risk being turned away at the pool.

Many residents like to enjoy our pools with friends and family. To make it easier for your guests 16 years or older, you are allowed to purchase 1 Smartcard Guest Pool Pass for **pool access only.** If you haven't already purchased one, you can call Administration to request the pass. **You will be required to return 1 of your current guest badges** to receive 1 Pool Smartcard guest pass. The guest pass is \$15 (non-refundable).

\*\*Reminder, if you decide not to purchase a guest Smartcard, the same guest rules apply.

"Guests are required to present their Guest badges for admission to pool areas. All guests must be accompanied by a resident in good standing. \*\*

Can't find your guest passes? Call Administration for replacements. Replacement Guest badges will be \$5 each to replace.

### **MAINTAINING 3' AREAS**

As Spring arrives and the weather begins to warm, let's all put in an effort into beautifying our Village! Maintenance of all shrubbery, leaves, and gardening within three feet of the building is the responsibility of the owner. Shrubbery and plantings should be trimmed under windowsill height when planted in front of a window. No shrubbery should be allowed to grow above the soffits of the building. The owner will be financially responsible for any damage caused by overgrowth of trees or shrubs in their 3-foot area. The 3-foot area should not be bounded by any borders higher than six inches without an approved permit from Administration. Planting of vegetables in the 3-foot area or on common grounds in the Village is prohibited. A farm area is provided for such use. Failure to maintain the 3-foot area may result in the Village having the work done, with all costs borne by the unit owner.

### Fresh Start - 3 Things to do every morning

Meditate – Soon after you wake up, spend 5-10 minutes meditating. A simple but effective form of meditation is the 4-7-8 breathing technique: breathing in for 4 seconds, holding the breath for 7 and exhaling for 8.
