





Paper Gang




The Paper Gang of CGL collects your newspapers, catalogs and magazines. The monies collected from the paper items goes to the purchase of

The Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Water Resources controls the use of water in the State of New Jersey.

In order to adhere to their regulation of water conservation, Cedar Glen Lakes must control the use of water during the peak summer months

Therefore, there will be NO watering of lawns, gardens, flowerbeds, or washing of cars except during the regulated period.

- 1. For the months of June, July, August and September, watering will be limited to a five hour period between the hours of 7:00 A.M. to 12:00 NOON **OR** 5:00 P.M. to 8:00 P.M. Starting on June 1, 2025.
- 2. *The Odd-Even system will apply*. That is: those houses with odd numbers will water on the odd calendar date; those houses with even numbers will water on the even calendar date. WHERE THERE ARE THIRTY-ONE (31) DAYS IN THE MONTH, NO WATERING WILL BE PERMITTED ON THE 31ST BY ANYONE.

For those individuals who violate this regulation, the matter will be referred to our Corporate Attorney for legal action.

We must try to conserve on water. Please cooperate and water only during your regulated period.





A camera with a zoom lens will allow you to get closer to the play. Try to think ahead of the game to get prepared for the actions. For example, if there is a runner on first with less than two outs, there's a good chance there will be a play at second base, either a steal or double-play attempt. You can zoom in and focus on second base before the play starts so you're ready when the action happens. If you chase the ball around the field you probably won't get the best shots.

It can be fun to take images of the fans as well. There are always plenty of children enjoying a day at the stadium. Buster, the BlueClaws' mascot, and the stadium crew are always entertaining as well.
