



Treasurer's Financial Recap

Income

February's top-line came in at \$248K, missing its \$252K budget, a \$4k miss on *Membership Dues*. *Membership Dues/Late Fees* generated less in February, as three homes closed here, versus a projection of five. We received \$5K compared with \$6.9K in our budget. With that said, year-to-date income has exceeded its budget of \$503K by \$25K, or 4.9%. *Billed Maintenance Work* generated \$745, which was not budgeted for February. *Rental Income* is the Parking Spaces and Boat and RV storage fees we collect, the account's budget for February is \$1,692. However, we collected \$1.850.

Expenses

Total expenses for February came in under its budget of \$252K at \$199K. Administration was \$34K, \$11K under its \$45K budget, mostly attributed to lower Legal Fees. Bus Expense exceeded its budget of \$2680 by \$1,360 on repairs. Clubhouse Expense was also over its budget of \$20K by \$2K as a result of colder weather, which increased utilities cost. In addition, we also had a one-off expense in our Water/Sewer bill for February due to a leaky toilet in the men's room. An extra 100,000 gallons made us go over by \$1,000. The toilet was fixed immediately. We called for a credit on the overage and received a \$500 credit on next quarter's bill. Grounds Maintenance came in \$14K under its \$55K, mostly on lower payroll, as the department is not running at full employment. Outside Contractor was under budget as a result of the lack of snow removal expense. Security expenses were \$1,225 over budget due to the payroll mix, as well as some additional guards needed for events like the comedy night.

Current Assets

On the close of business February 28, 2025 our Capital Reserve and Operating totaled \$1.67 million and \$365K, respectively, for a total of \$2.04 million.

President's Letter

I can almost taste summer! Finally, May is upon us. As everyone knows, we have a new landscape contractor, Picture Perfect Landscaping. By now, I am sure that everyone has experienced their work. Summer planting is beginning to ramp up, and the mulch has gone down. I have confidence that we will find success with Picture Perfect, as Craig, the owner is always available and easily approachable. Throughout May, you'll also notice Joe and the Grounds Team readying the pool deck for the summer.

Speaking of the pool, in early April, as planned we replaced the heaters in the kidney-shape pool, for roughly \$12K, so expect the water to be wonderful and warm when the pool opens on Memorial Day Weekend. In addition, as planned, we replaced the second set of salt-cells for around \$6.5k. The salt-cells are responsible for converting the salt into chlorine via electrolysis, yet keeping the water silky smooth. Last season we replaced one set, as a set is needed for each pool.

In May the lake fountains will be up and running as we now have the new electric panels for each. Each panel replacement was about \$3K. If you recall,



last year we had the fountain motors rebuilt, which were completed in October and earlier this year we needed to replace the circuits that operate them, as they were quite old.

Throughout the community you'll notice the benches are being replaced. In early 2024, we purchased, I think 48 or so. We will be offering the residents to purchase plaques for remembrance or dedication for the benches. You'll hear more on that as the bench project unfolds.

Our Architectural Control Committee (ACC), was introduced to everyone at our March open meeting. They have been riding around the community and meeting residents. Remember, they're your friends and neighbors and want to work with you to keep your property looking great. Also, at our March meeting, Carl from Greenbriar Patrol gave a presentation highlighting the department's Do's and Don'ts.

We had a stellar turnout at our dance party in April. Over 200 residents came out for a wonderful evening of dancing to The Briar Connection. The Briar Connection is a local band comprised of Greenbriar and Greenbriar II residents. Our Auditorium rocked, with a crowded dance floor, a few cocktails, and a sultry, cabaret vibe. We made around \$1100.

With May comes our Memorial Day Party. I am excited for this. The party will run from 2pm-10pm on Saturday May 24th. The party is open to residents only, please do not forget to wear your badges. This dance-centric party is free of charge. The DJ will be sponsored by our new landscape contractor, Picture Perfect, and our catering will be paid for by Willow Springs. It will be a fun, casual-vibe event, without assigned seating. Bring some drinks and snacks. Even though it is a free, open event, please give the office a call before mid-May so that we can have a guesstimate on the number of attendees.

I ask for you all to check on your neighbors, whom may be elderly or housebound. A little extra kindness goes a long way and will boomerang back. Well, I guess that is it for now.



SWIMMING POOL RULES AND SAFETY REGULATIONS Revised March 31, 2025

The Board of Trustees has adopted the following rules and regulations.

The rules and regulations pertain to the entire fenced-in area surrounding the swimming pools. They are with the sole intent to ensure a SAFE and PLEASANT experience for residents and guests. Children must be between 3-17 years of age. Children under 3 years of age are NOT permitted in the pool or pool area.

Badges are required for entry and must be visibly worn by all residents and guests. All guests must be accompanied by a resident and must supply their own chairs. Although guests are welcomed, our residents are not to be inconvenienced by a limited supply of pool furniture. On weekends, Friday, Saturday and Sunday, chaise lounges are reserved for residents and are limited to one lounge per household. Pools are cleaned daily.

HOURS

Residents and guests 18 years and older welcomed from 10am to closing. Guests ages 3-17 are limited to the kidney shaped pool from 10am-12pm and 4pm-6pm.

POOL RULES

- 1. Any person showing evidence of any communicable skin disease, inflamed eyes, cold symptoms, nasal or ear discharge, or any other communicable disease will be denied entry.
- 2. Any person with excessive sunburn, open blisters, wounds, or bandages will be denied entry.
- 3. Please do not enter the pools if you are experiencing or recovering from diarrhea or have had symptoms of gastrointestinal (stomach) disease within the past seven (7) days.
- 4. Adults or children wearing incontinent undergarments, diapers, and/or plastic pants will not be allowed in the pools.
- 5. Children should be encouraged to use the restroom before entering the pool. Please immediately report all "accidents" observed in the pools to a pool attendant.
- 6. No animals, except service animals, shall be allowed on to the pool deck, dressing rooms, or any other parts of the enclosure.
- 7. Food and drink are allowed only at your chair and/or table. Please clean up after yourselves. NO GLASS CONTAINERS.
- 8. Conduct that endangers the safety and comfort of others is prohibited.

- 9. Outdoor bathing shall be prohibited during an electrical storm.
- 10. Persons suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall be prohibited from entering the pools and security will be notified.
- 11. Toys, floating objects, snorkels, fins, etc. are not allowed in the pool. Arm floaties, noodles, life preservers and similar floatation devices are permitted.
- 12. Children must always be accompanied by a resident with a badge. This person is responsible for the children's actions.
- 13. Bathing attire is not permitted in the clubhouse. Entrance to the restrooms must be made from the pool area only. A covering wrap is required outside of the fenced -in area and in the clubhouse. Individuals must be dry to enter the clubhouse.
- 14. All person(s) using the pool must wear acceptable bathing attire (no cutoffs or clothing are allowed).
- 15. We ask that swimmers shower prior to entering the pool water.
- 16. Bicycles, scooters, and strollers are not allowed in the pool area. Handicap scooters and wheelchairs are permitted but must always keep away from the pool edge.
- 17. Smoking is not permitted as per local ordinance and is only allowed in designated areas.
- 18. No ball playing, running, rough play, diving or jumping into the pools is permitted.
- 19. Swimming is prohibited when the clubhouse is closed. Pools must be vacated by 10pm.
- 20. Evening swimming from 6pm-10pm is limited to adults 18 and over and is at your own risk. Swimming alone is prohibited; another person must be present.
- 21. No one is to sit within 4 feet of the edge of the pools. This includes handicap scooters, wheelchairs, lounge chairs and anything that impedes the area around the pool. In addition, sitting on the edge or stairs of the pool is prohibited.

A Reminder from Rules Regs

11.16 LANDSCAPING PLANTINGS

- 11.16.1 No personal plantings are permitted on common grounds or on the side of driveway that is not bordering the home. This approval is to assure plantings do not impede mowing operations. ALL exceptions must be submitted to the Board for approval.
- 11.16.2 A sketch showing number, variety and location of proposed planting exceptions must be submitted to the Board Approval.
- 11.16.3 Personal plantings are permitted up to 36" from the foundation of the house, on the sides and rear, and a maximum of 8 feet from the foundation in the front of the house. The following plants are prohibited:
- Wisteria sinensis (Chinese Wisteria)
- Clematis ternifolia (Japanese clematis)
- Lonicera japonica (Japanese Honeysuckle)
- Acer platanoides (Norway maple)
- Euonymus alatus (Winged Burning Bush)
- Berberis thunbergii (Japanese Barberry)
- Viburnum dilatatum (Linden Viburnum)
- Miscanthus sinensis (Chinese Silver grass)
- Bambusoideae (Bamboo)
- Wisteria floribunda (Japanese Wisteria)
- Hedera helix (English Ivy)
- Ampelopsis brevipedunculata (porcelainberry)
- Pyrus calleryana (Callery/Bradford pear)
- Euonymus fortune (Wintercreeper)
- Buddleia spp (Butterfly Bush)
- Spiraea japonica (Japanese Meadowsweet)
- Paulownia tomentosa (Princess Tree)
- 11.16.4 Despite the granting of permission, any damage done to sprinkler and/or utility lines by homeowner's plantings shall be charged to the homeowners.
- 11.16.5 If maintenance operations such as sprinkler heads, lawn watering, mowing, etc. are hindered or obstructed by such personal plantings they may be removed, at the owner's expense.
- 11.16.6 The homeowner is responsible to ensure that shrubs do not become overgrown and unsightly and do not reach the height of the soffits. If the homeowner fails to keep personal plantings trimmed, the Association has the right to have the trimming done, and to add the labor costs to the resident's maintenance.
- 11.16.7 Residents are responsible for weed removal in beds. A work order can be submitted.
- 11.16.8 Fees for additional service provided by Greenbriar's Ground Department are listed in the Greenbriar Resident Revised Paid Services Document.
- 11.16.9 Decorative items must be made of materials specifically for landscape use, concrete ceramic, resin, or metal. The resident is responsible for maintaining the items in good repair and satisfactory appearance. Broken items are to be removed promptly.
- 11.16.10 Cafe size tables & chairs and Adirondack type chairs designed for outdoor use are permitted.
- 11.16.11 Holiday decorations may be of any chosen material made for exterior decorative purposes.
- 11.16.12 Holiday decorations may be displayed 2 weeks prior to any given holiday and up to 1 week after the specific holiday, at which time they are to be removed.
- 11.16.13 December holiday decorations are permitted the day after Thanksgiving and up to January 8th of the following year, at which time they are to be removed.

all are slightly uncomfortable. Someone knew each of the individuals in the group, but what was the connection? And the mystery begins.

Using a series of flashbacks the reader learns these individuals all have a shady past, including murder or in some cases "accidental murder". Who is guilty and who is not becomes the overriding question?

Everyone begins to feel they are being judged. Then the accidental deaths of the characters begin one by one in the manor house. Due to the seasonal rough seas the boat cannot get across to the mainland and get the group off the island. Who is the killer?

The reader learns several clues for each murder but who is the mastermind behind all these murders? The characters accuse each other, and the story continues until then there were none.

The Book Discussion Group first talked about Agatha Christie's successes; author, playwright, movie scripts, and a record number of books read.

A discussion began of biblical themes based on David and Bathsheba. What is justice and who is charged with seeking justice and determining justice? Is one individual allowed to determine justice? Agatha Christie entwines her reader on a mysterious path and sometimes raises more questions than answers. While there is no love interest in the novel, characters were crafted to fit the plot, and the plot was crafted to fit the characters. Meticulous writing keeps the reader involved until the very end.

All members recommended reading the book, even for a second or third read. Enjoy!





The Sound of Love

When you're a child you don't understand the adult world. You don't know how things get done, what things cost or the difficult choices adults have to make. Often those choices are made for the benefit of their kids, and too often those kids are ungrateful little brats who see their parents as unreasonable ogres: heavy handed, overbearing and doing everything in their power to lord over them and keep them from having fun.

In my childhood the world was a different place. The Women's Rights movement was a new thing and societal norms still had women mostly limited to more traditional roles around the house. It was a time when women were not paid as well as men for the same job.

My Mom wasn't typical for that time: A divorced working mother with two school age boys at home. She worked in an office doing the standard secretarial duties but surely also had the subservient tasks expected of women in those days: Making coffee, smiling and maybe flirting a little with visiting clients, and laughing off inappropriate comments about her tush.

We weren't poor but the budget was tight. One



way Mom got around this was by making her own work clothes. She'd go to the fabric store for cloth and a pattern, and one of the oft heard sounds of my youth was the Singer sewing machine hard at work. Us kids never realized that making her own clothes was actually something she did for us, a way of saving money so we could have nice gifts at Christmas.

Being typical rough and tumble boys we made more work for her. We ripped out the knees of pants playing football and found all kinds of ways to add to her already full plate. She always did whatever was necessary and never complained about it. The sewing machine was just a vehicle through which the depth of her love for us was shown.

She put those skills to use all her life. When we grew up and our friends had children of their own she made baby blankets and booties for them or frilly dresses for the girls. In her elder years, she fashioned costumes for the tap dance group she performed with, well into her 80's.

My brother and myself never understood that the sound of the sewing machine was the sound of love. Our childhoods were happy and maybe that's why we ended up well adjusted adults and not some guy on the roof of The Chrysler Building with a rifle taking pot shots at the people below.

Mom passed away in 2016 but no Mother's Day goes by without feeling gratitude for the sacrifices she made, and the things she denied herself, to make sure we were happy and provided for. Does anything show your love for another better than taking on personal sacrifice for them?

What is the sound of love? It's any sound you associate with someone you love, and for me the sound of that sewing machine was one. 





Tommy's Tavern + Tapas

Your intrepid newspaper staff went to Tommy's to taste what the always full parking lot was all about. To our delight we quickly found out. The Tavern is cavernous inside. The walls are covered in TV's, all showing various sports games. On the day we went the Mets were playing the Miami team on some TVs and on the other it was soccer. Rita and I both ordered the Old-School Chicken Salad Sandwich. I can't figure out what was old school about it. The chicken was roasted and cut into nice sized pieces. The chicken was covered with bacon, onion and chipotle mayo. I had the regular fries and Rita ordered the sweet potato fries. All of us really liked these unique sandwiches. REALLY! We felt the fries could have been served warmer. The sweet potatoes came with a unique dipping sauce, marshmallow fluff with cinnamon. Yes, you read that right marshmallow fluff! Recipes

Chicken Pot Pie is a favorite of mine, but it never dawned on me to make it. I found this recipe in THE ULTIMATE CAST IRON COOKBOOK RECENTLY and I didn't think it looked too hard. I will use a frozen pie crust. Sometimes little fixes make a thing that might be a no-no why not try it! I hope you do. Bon Appetite!!

Chicken Pot Pie

2 tablespoons olive oil

1/2 yellow onion, diced

1 garlic clove, chopped

1 carrot, peeled and chopped

11/4 cups whole milk, at room temperature

2 tablespoons unsalted butter, cut into smaller slices

2 tablespoons all-purpose flour, plus more for dusting

1½ cups cooked chicken, cut into bitesized pieces 34 cup chopped frozen green beans

Salt and pepper, to taste

½ teaspoon cayenne pepper (optional)

1 Flaky Pastry Crust (see page 215)

1 tablespoon half-and-half

- 1 Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- In a small skillet other than the cast-iron skillet, heat the olive oil. Add the onion and garlic and cook, while stirring, for about 2 minutes. Add the carrot, reduce the heat to low, cover, and cook, while stirring occasionally, until the carrots start to soften and the onion caramelizes, about 5 minutes. Set aside.
- 3 Before starting to make the white sauce, be sure the milk is at room temperature. If it's not, microwave it so that it's just warm, about 15 to 20 seconds. Have the milk ready.
- 4 Place the butter in a 12-inch cast-iron skillet and melt over medium heat. Sprinkle the flour over it and stir quickly yet gently to blend. Reduce the heat slightly so the butter doesn't burn. Stir until the butter and flour form a soft paste.
- 5 Add just a little of the warm milk and stir constantly to blend it in. Add more milk in small increments, working after each addition to stir

- it into the flour-and-butter mixture smoothly. Work in this manner until all the milk has been incorporated. Continue to stir the sauce while cooking over low heat until it thickens, about 5 minutes.
- 6 Add the chicken pieces, green beans, and vegetable mixture from the other skillet. Season with salt and pepper. If you want a hint of heat, add the cayenne pepper.
- On a flour-dusted work surface, roll out the crust so it will fit over the filling. Lay it gently on top, push down slightly to secure, and cut 3 or 4 slits in the middle. Brush the crust with the half-and-half.
- Put the skillet in the oven and bake for 30 to 40 minutes, until the crust is browned and the filling is bubbly.
- 9 Remove from the oven and let cool slightly before serving.









DRYER VENT FIRES

Introduction

5,600 fires.

15 deaths.

400 injuries.

\$99 million in direct property loss.

That was the average toll taken by fires caused by clothes dryers between 2002 and 2004, according to the U.S. Fire Administration (USFA).

Many homeowners consider their clothes dryer a necessity. However, improper installation or maintenance of this appliance can pose a serious fire risk to families. The leading factor contributing to dryer fires is failure to clean lint from traps, vents and areas surrounding the dryer.

This guide covers the proper selection, installation and maintenance of vents for clothes dryers.

Signs of a Blocked Dryer Vent

- Lengthy drying times
- Clothes are hotter than normal at the end of the dry cycle
- Dryer deactivation due to high temperatures
- Increased heat and humidity in the area of the dryer
- Flapper on vent hood does not open when dryer is on

Why are Dryers Vented?

After the washer's spin cycle has finished, a typical 12-pound load of laundry weighs about 20 pounds. This means that the dryer will need to dispose of about a gallon of water with every load. A dryer vent removes this moisture as well as heat and lint produced by the clothes dryer to the exterior of a home.

As the dryer forces hot air through a rotating drum and the heat removes water from the clothes, lint forms. Lint is a highly flammable fiber that will ignite easily. While most moisture and heat vent to the outside, the removable lint filter traps most lint ,before it reaches the vent but some lint will always get by the filter. When trapped in the vent, lint will reduce the venting capacity and can eventually lead to a total blockage. It will also reduce the efficiency of the dryer and can result in a buildup of excess heat, moisture and lint into your home. It is important to clean lint from the lint filter before or after every load.

Vent Materials

Several types of ducting material are available for venting a clothes dryer. The preferred material is either a rigid aluminum or galvanized steel duct. The use of flexible metal ducting may be an acceptable alternative to rigid metal duct.

The flexible thin foil and flexible plastic accordion style vents sold in home improvement stores are unacceptable materials for venting a dryer. These vents can sag and allow lint to accumulate and catch fire if exposed to sufficient heat.

Proper Venting

The best venting arrangement is to exhaust directly outdoors in the straightest, shortest distance possible. Unfortunately, trends in new construction now place the dryer in convenient but nontraditional areas of the home such as upstairs laundry rooms, hallways and bathrooms. These installations generally require longer vent lengths to reach the outside and involve sharp turns and bends to navigate the structure.

The International Building Code and Underwriters Laboratories limit the length of a dryer vent to a maximum of 25 feet. Every 45-degree bend in the vent reduces the total allowable length by 2 1/2 feet and every 90-degree bend reduces the allowable length by 5 feet. However, some dryers may have rated lengths that exceed those established by this standard so it is best to check the manual for each dryer to determine the maximum allowable length of the dryer vent. There is also maximum allowable height requirements set by the manufacturers for each model.

Dryer Vent Fires Continued from page 36

The dryer vent must be independent of all other systems and terminate outdoors. Never vent the dryer into another vent or chimney, the attic, a wall or a crawl space. On the outside, install a vent hood that is equipped with a back draft damper.

Proper Dryer Maintenance

When completed regularly, a few simple, inexpensive measures can help detect a problem with a dryer vent before it becomes a fire hazard and may even reduce wear on the dryer and energy costs to operate the dryer.

- 1. Remove lint from the lint filter before or after each load. Inspect the filter for rips before placing it back in the dryer.
- 2. Wash the lint filter with soap and water every couple of months to reduce the waxy residue left behind by dryer sheets.
- 3. Inspect and clean outside wall dampers on a regular basis.
- 4. Disconnect, clean and inspect the dryer duct and venting at least every two years. In homes with higher use or long vent runs, this should occur every year. You can also hire a professional to complete this service.
- 5. Vacuum lint from behind and beneath your dryer on a regular basis.
- 6. Have your dryer professionally serviced and cleaned by a factory-authorized service representative every two to three years.

RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION UNDERWRITERS OF AMERICA

- > Replace plastic and metal foil vents with 4 inch minimum diameter rigid metal vents.
- > Vent dryers directly to the outside in the shortest, straightest distance possible.
- > Insulate the dryer vent to protect it from lower outside temperatures.
- > Remind residents to clean the lint filter before or after drying every load and to read and follow the dryer manufacturer's operating guidelines and suggested maintenance practices.
- > Inspect the dryer vent termination point at least annually for blockages, bird nests or the presence of other wildlife.
- > Never turn on a dryer and then leave the house.
- > Purchase and install a portable fire extinguisher in an accessible area near the laundry room.

Fitness Facts By Dr. Toni



Spring is here, and gardening can be a great form of exercise. In fact, gardening can burn up to 300 calories in an hour. If done improperly, gardening just like exercise, may cause problems for your body.

Here are a few tips to keep you healthy as you garden:

Warm up: As with any type of exercise it is important to "get the blood flowing". You can do this by starting with a 10-minute walk.

- Listen to your body: If you feel achy and tired in certain muscles, it is time for a break, or to change positions. As a general rule, you should change your position every 10 minutes or so.
- Don't bend over from your back: When you bend down to pull weeds, or grab for something, make sure to bend from your knees, as well as contract your abdominal muscles for additional support.



- Kneel properly: If you plan on being down on the ground, attempt to squat or kneel on one knee, rotating between knees. Use a kneeling cushion for the health of your knee joints and perhaps purchase one with sidebars. The sidebars which will make it easier to get up from the ground. If you choose to use planter boxes, you can avoid kneeling.
- Use the right tools: Use tools that are ergonomically designed to reduce stress on your hands and wrists. Wide gripped tools can help prevent injuries such as carpal tunnel. If you are tall, avoid tools with short handles. This will cause you to bend from your back, which can cause injury over time.
- Avoid twisting at the waist: Turn your feet when in the direction of your work to keep your back healthy.
- Keep hydrated: As with any outdoor activity, it is important to drink lots of water to keep cool and prevent dehydration which can lead to injury.

Cool down: When finished gardening, take a short walk around the yard to admire your work! This will give your body a chance to return to a resting state.

Before you do any gardening, please stretch before to get your body ready to work without the tightness and stiffness that results from this work. Stretching reduces muscle tension and makes the work easier.
