



President's Letter

The fountains at the lake are up and running

and the lake shimmers decadently. Our grounds are equally as lovely, especially with the crisp, continuous edging of our lawns and trimming of the creek-bed. Our residents seem to be pleased with our new land-scape contractor, Picture Perfect. Up at the Clubhouse, our pools are brilliantly clear and it has been an absolute pleasure to see everyone poolside. Last month, we successfully fired up the kilns in the ceramic room and are working on a schedule for the room to be a shared workspace between ceramics and crochet. Albeit, the yarn will be outside of that room for fire safety.

Our Memorial Day party was a success. Nearly 330 people turned out for the free event. Again, the event was sponsored by our vendors and Willow Springs. What made it so special was the turnout of folks, many of whom do not generally come up to the Clubhouse or attend our functions. It was a sense of community.

This month, we will celebrate July 4th, with a Fourth of July party. The party will be on Friday, July 4th at 2pm-7pm. Tickets are limited to 250 people, however the pool will be open at 10am for those who are not attending the festivities, as well. Our new fan-favorite DJ, Valentino, will be spinning a great mix of music, as he did for Memorial Day. Make sure you wear your wristbands, as they will give you access to food and drinks. On the menu are veggie burgers, cheese and regular burgers, grilled chicken breast, two hotdog carts with chili and toppings, pasta primavera, coleslaw, and potato salad.

Over the summer, Willow Springs intends to sponsor another movie night, poolside, like last summer. We are also planning an "I Love Lucy" & "Three Stooges" marathon one weekend evening, later in the month, with popcorn. The dates still need to be determined.

During May's open meeting, I shared with everyone an email that I received from Falcon, the engineering firm, which drew up the plans for the HVAC system. If you recall, the email mentioned a "plan B," which was news to your current and past board -I am sure enough in saying, I never heard of their "plan B." In early June, Falcon scheduled a meeting with the Board to share plan B, which was not an option when asked of them 18 months ago, but I digress. During the meet-

ing it was casually mentioned that they can replace the components of our current system for around ½ the cost of the new system. Again, this was something that 18 months ago they said they could not do.

So, I am waiting with bated breath. The energy savings of a new system would take at least *fifteen* years for pay-back. In my opinion, that is too long. I like that we can have the HVAC running with new components and a computer management system for ½ the cost of a full replacement. In addition, there would be little or no downtime in the Clubhouse. If this pans out, we can easily swing the cost. We would still be quite a bit away from the completion, as we would have to send the job out to bid again since it would be all new specs. As I get information and the job scope begins to gel, I'll share it through my voice shots to keep you all in the loop. Also, I am still waiting for the results of our capital reserve study, completed at the end of March. I'll keep you all in the loop with that as well.

Well, I guess that is it for now. See you at the next opening meeting. Remember, together, we are all Greenbriar. Enjoy the beautiful weather!

Treasurer's Financial Recap

Income

April's top-line came in at \$252K which is under its \$253K budget, due to interest payment timing. An extra 2 homes closed in April. With that said, income year to date is up 43K over projection on *Membership Dues*, and *Parking Space Rentals*.

Expenses

Administration is under budget \$1,700 on lower-than-expected legal fees. Bus is over budget by \$2K due to repairs for brakes and rotors. Clubhouse Expense was over \$2K for the month due to an increase in salaries for events. Grounds are under budget for April because the tree replacement budget was not used for the month, irrigation electricity was also not used. And finally, the maintenance team is continuing to run leaner with less guys. Outside Contractors is under budget by 5.5K due to the spring seeding not hitting the budget for April. The new lawn care contract for Picture Perfect is saving us \$1,600 each month. Security was over \$3.7K for the month due to new tires needed on the patrol vehicle as well as the payroll mix to cover vacation time.

Current Assets

On the close of business April 30th, 2025, our Capital Reserve and Operating totaled \$1.68 million and \$461K, respectively, for a total of \$2.14 million.

SWIMMING POOL RULES AND SAFETY REGULATIONS Revised March 31, 2025

The Board of Trustees has adopted the following rules and regulations.

The rules and regulations pertain to the entire fenced-in area surrounding the swimming pools. They are with the sole intent to ensure a SAFE and PLEASANT experience for residents and guests. Children must be between 3-17 years of age. Children under 3 years of age are NOT permitted in the pool or pool area.

Badges are required for entry and must be visibly worn by all residents and guests. All guests must be accompanied by a resident and must supply their own chairs. Although guests are welcomed, our residents are not to be inconvenienced by a limited supply of pool furniture. On weekends, Friday, Saturday and Sunday, chaise lounges are reserved for residents and are limited to one lounge per household. Pools are cleaned daily.

HOURS

Residents and guests 18 years and older welcomed from 10am to closing. Guests ages 3-17 are limited to the kidney shaped pool from 10am-12pm and 4pm-6pm.

POOL RULES

- 1. Any person showing evidence of any communicable skin disease, inflamed eyes, cold symptoms, nasal or ear discharge, or any other communicable disease will be denied entry.
- 2. Any person with excessive sunburn, open blisters, wounds, or bandages will be denied entry.
- 3. Please do not enter the pools if you are experiencing or recovering from diarrhea or have had symptoms of gastrointestinal (stomach) disease within the past seven (7) days.
- 4. Adults or children wearing incontinent undergarments, diapers, and/or plastic pants will not be allowed in the pools.
- 5. Children should be encouraged to use the restroom before entering the pool. Please immediately report all "accidents" observed in the pools to a pool attendant.
- 6. No animals, except service animals, shall be allowed on to the pool deck, dressing rooms, or any other parts of the enclosure.
- 7. Food and drink are allowed only at your chair and/or table. Please clean up after yourselves. NO GLASS CONTAINERS.
- 8. Conduct that endangers the safety and comfort of others is prohibited.

- 9. Outdoor bathing shall be prohibited during an electrical storm.
- 10. Persons suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall be prohibited from entering the pools and security will be notified.
- 11. Toys, floating objects, snorkels, fins, etc. are not allowed in the pool. Arm floaties, noodles, life preservers and similar floatation devices are permitted.
- 12. Children must always be accompanied by a resident with a badge. This person is responsible for the children's actions.
- 13. Bathing attire is not permitted in the clubhouse. Entrance to the restrooms must be made from the pool area only. A covering wrap is required outside of the fenced -in area and in the clubhouse. Individuals must be dry to enter the clubhouse.
- 14. All person(s) using the pool must wear acceptable bathing attire (no cutoffs or clothing are allowed).
- 15. We ask that swimmers shower prior to entering the pool water.
- 16. Bicycles, scooters, and strollers are not allowed in the pool area. Handicap scooters and wheelchairs are permitted but must always keep away from the pool edge.
- 17. Smoking is not permitted as per local ordinance and is only allowed in designated areas.
- 18. No ball playing, running, rough play, diving or jumping into the pools is permitted.
- 19. Swimming is prohibited when the clubhouse is closed. Pools must be vacated by 10pm.
- 20. Evening swimming from 6pm-10pm is limited to adults 18 and over and is at your own risk. Swimming alone is prohibited; another person must be present.
- 21. No one is to sit within 4 feet of the edge of the pools. This includes handicap scooters, wheelchairs, lounge chairs and anything that impedes the area around the pool. In addition, sitting on the edge or stairs of the pool is prohibited.



Her love of the arts found her with jobs at four university campuses across the US where she brought in acts and programs for art, music and theater. In the more recent past, Bea worked at NJ PAC in Newark for ten years, running the Cabaret Se-

ries and at the time, the Broadway Series. While there, she was event manager for over 150 performances per season. This was a most wonderful job for her. She has also loved attending the indie film series that was formerly held in Eatontown and which has now moved to SOPAC in South Orange.









Toys of Yesteryear

Richard James was devising a spring that would keep equipment steady in rough seas.



SUMMER VEGETABLES WITH YOGURT PESTO *

CHARGRILLED VEGETABLES CREATE A DELICIOUS LIGHT MEAL ON THEIR OWN, OR ARE EQUALLY GOOD SERVED AS A MEDITERRANEAN-STYLE ACCOMPANIMENT TO VEGETARIAN MAIN MEALS.

SERVES FOUR

INGREDIENTS

- 2 small aubergines (eggplants)
- 2 large courgettes (zucchini)
- I red (bell) pepper
- 1 yellow (bell) pepper
- 1 fennel bulb
- 1 red onion
- 10ml/2 tsp olive oil
- salt and ground black pepper

For the yogurt pesto


- 150ml/½ pint/2/s cup fat-free Greek (US strained plain) yogurt
- 15ml/1 tbsp pesto
- 1 Cut the aubergines into 1cm/½in slices. Sprinkle with salt and leave to drain for about 30 minutes. Rinse well in cold running water and pat dry.



- 2 Cut the courgettes in half lengthways. Cut the peppers in half, removing the seeds but leaving the stalks intact. Set aside.
- 3 Slice the fennel bulb and the red onion into thick wedges. Set aside.



Baby vegetables make excellent candidates for grilling (broiling) whole, so look out for baby aubergines (eggplants) and (bell) peppers, in particular. There's no need to salt the aubergines if they're small.





- 4 Stir the yogurt and pesto lightly together in a serving bowl, to make a marbled sauce. Set aside.
- 5 Arrange the vegetables over a hot barbecue, or under a hot grill (broiler), lightly brush with the olive oil and sprinkle with plenty of salt and pepper.



6 Cook the vegetables until golden brown and tender, turning occasionally. The aubergines and peppers will take about 6–8 minutes to cook, and the courgettes, onion and fennel will take about 4–5 minutes. Serve the vegetables immediately, with the yogurt pesto.

The police officers encouraged people to call police not just in emergencies but also if you are feeling unsafe, seeing unfamiliar cars, salespeople, contractors on your street. They discussed the dog leash law; dogs cannot run loose in Brick and Greenbriar. We heard a lot of good information. We thank Brick Police for their time and Service.

Our second speaker was Pat Musico a resident of Greenbriar. Pat published a Cookbook for the blind and low vision impaired. Pat is a member of the NJ Commission for the Blind. The cookbook was approved by the Commission.

Pat brought in copies of her Cookbook for the Blind and Toaster Bags she uses for her own cooking. Recipes use Toaster Bags to cook food in your toaster

(not toaster oven). The recipes include meat, chicken, fish, meatballs, meatloaf, vegetables, and some desserts. Pat wrote and used pictures of actual cooked recipes, and the book comes with detailed instructions to cook with the toaster bags including amounts of food and time for cooking in your toaster. The Cookbook is useful for college students, teenagers, senior citizens, and RV life. The Toaster Bags are reusable and dishwasher safe. The cookbook and Toaster Bags are available on Amazon.com.

Pat also spoke about new vision glasses for the blind using iPhone Technology. These glasses using a camera in the frame will give verbal cues to the person wearing the glasses. For example, how many people are in a room, what a person is wearing and what colors, what obstacles are in a room.

Information for this technology and eyeglasses is available through the NJ Commission for the Blind and Low Vision Impaired.

Pat continues her work by being a volunteer consultant for the blind. She contacts them by phone; she has 55 clients in 9 support groups. She helps newly blind people navigate through their lives. Kiwanis thanks our neighbor Pat Musico for her service and time.



The Sound of Love, Part Two

I'm a child of divorce. In spite of what armchair psychiatrist's might say it doesn't always turn you into a flawed adult: angry, bitter, dysfunctional in your relationships with the people in your life.

Growing up I had two families: A New Jersey family with whom I lived and spent most of my time and a Long Island family whom I saw several times a year including a fun filled three weeks in the summer. They were weeks marked by outings on Dad's boat, nights at the drive-in movies or stock car races and trips to Carvel for what we thought was the best ice cream ever made.

The boat trips were especially memorable. One thing we loved was when Dad let us take the wheel. "Just keep it headed towards that bridge," he'd tell us as he pointed the bow towards the Robert Moses Causeway. It was one of the first times I felt like a cool kid, deftly piloting that vessel across the open water like a seasoned boat captain.

On the days we went fishing Dad made it easy for us. He rigged our lines and baited our hooks and all we had to do was just find the bottom and wait for a tug on the line to keep reeling in the plentiful Blowfish and Fluke of the Great South Bay.

Other days were for swimming. We'd head to Hemlock Cove, a sandy bottomed section of bay bordering on a thin strip of land with a wild undeveloped ocean beach on the other side. After enjoying the cove we'd make a mad dash across Sunrise Highway to the ocean side to body surf and jump waves. Decades later that remote, reed covered strip of land became known to the rest of the world as the burial grounds of the Gilgo Beach killer.

When you grow up around the water it becomes part of you. Dad gave each of us the love of boating and whenever I speak to one of my Brothers or Sisters it isn't long before the conversation turns to those days. We share feelings of mutual gratitude for our childhoods. Such memories last a lifetime.

Dad passed away 25 years ago but my Sister still lives in his house and most visits to see her include some time spent on the boat. On our way to Hemlock Cove we ease slowly past Fox Island which is just as I

remember it, meaning a new generation of green head flies lie in wait to descend upon us and find us just as tasty as when we were kids.

Just as the sound of my Mother's sewing machine was the sound of her love so was the rumble of Dad's boat engine. It was a sound that not only said, "We're gonna have fun today kids," but also "I love you Son."

On Father's Day I remember my Father for the kind hearted man he was. He helped us forge memories we would remember long after we'd grown up and made sure our childhoods were full of fun. More importantly we always felt loved in his presence. Happy Father's Day, Bill Sr, you were a great Dad!


