


Happy May! and all indications are that the pool will open this month unless there is some unforeseen event. As it stands now we will have an opening around the 15th of May. Please make sure you update your pool passes for 2025. Either go to the Association Office or watch for after-hours dates and times to get this done. I know we will be updating passes before bingo. Please read and follow the updated pool rules available in this issue. Most of all, just be courteous of others and enjoy yourself.

Let's talk trash pickup. I have been hearing some questions about our new trash contract. I would like to clear up a few; most of which have nothing to do with the service we are receiving. First, let me reiterate that none of the trash companies were willing to continue with concierge service. As a matter of fact, Meadowbrook was the only bidder who was willing to do even the 6 months that they did. The robo-cans are provided by Meadowbrook Carting and are their colors, and their property. The only thing that should be painted on the

can is your address. The cans also have serial numbers on them and are registered to the address where they were delivered. Last, but not least, does it really matter what type of truck picks up the trash as long as it's taken? The fact is, we lease that truck from the carter which allows us to save a substantial amount on dumping fees. One last comment: please place your can in the garage or on the side of your home. You may install a fence or screen to block the view so check with ACC.

Finally, the paving project: be assured that lower Buckingham and the Circle will be done this year. The sewer scoping is complete and the concrete and tree replacements are scheduled for upper Buckingham.

I have had to check my patience at the door when I came on the Board. I too, would like things done yesterday as you would. We on the Board enjoy the pool and drive on Buckingham just like you do so we have no reason to delay repairs. We simply have to adjust the process as it unfolds.

I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Mr. Marottoli.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence was led by Mr. Kowaliwskyj.

V. REVIEW/APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Kowaliwskyj MOTIONED to approve the Minutes of February 19, 2025. Mr. Passman SECONDED. None Opposed (Mr. Wiseman and Mr. Glenn were absent and abstained). MOTION CARRIED.

VI TREASURER'S REPORT

- Statement of Cash Flow as of March 12, 2025
 - a. Ken Wiseman presented the financial report for the last month:
- Charges and Payments:
 - a. Operating account payments totaled \$222,139.87.
 - b. Reserves contribution was \$32,809.30.
 - c. Lawn and snow expenses were \$59,355.03, covering snow removal from February 12th.

- d. Pool management cost \$30,167.
- e. Cable bill was \$71,806.88.
- f. Insurance was \$12,027.50.
- g. Garbage removal cost \$71,663.70.
- CDs and Balances:
 - a. CDs are yielding 4.2% to 4.3%.
 - b. Total balances as of March 10th: Operating account \$802,225.57, Reserves \$2,271,830.78, Lawn and Snow \$655,383.21, Total \$3,722,646.40.
- Motion to Accept Financial Statement: Approved unanimously.
 - a. Motion to accept the statement of cash flows dated March 12th, 2024 made by Mr. Glenn; seconded by Ms. Miller; Passed unanimously.

VII. PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Mr. Marottoli)

- New Appointments:
 - o Diane Bame appointed to the board.
 - o Andy Passman appointed as vice president.
- Trash Can Distribution: New blue and yellow trash cans have begun being delivered.
- Geese Police Contract: Canceled effective March 1st, saving \$1,400 monthly,
 \$16,800 annually. An ad hoc committee is studying alternative solutions.
- The pool renovation is progressing well, with an expected opening in May. The
 board decided to replace the entire pool fence instead of just sections due to the
 age of the fence (original fence since the pool was first built) and the likelihood that
 sections would have to be replaced when reinstalled.

VIII. MANAGER'S REPORT (Ms. D'imé)

Trash Can Distribution

Mary discussed the distribution of new trash cans. Two sizes were available: 64-gallon and 32-gallon options. The 32-gallon cans are special ordered, and a waiting list has been created for those who want the smaller size. Removal of old pit cans at a cost of \$48 can be arranged at the office and will be done by Down-to Earth.

Garbage Pickup Schedule

The garbage pickup schedule is changing from twice a week every Tuesday and Friday to once a week on either Tuesday or Wednesday. A color-coded map showing the collection day and order of pick up for each street was provided in the March issue of the Knoll News. Routes have been reorganized and are much more efficient.

Garbage Collection—Other Garbage Cans

- Current garbage collection involves manual pickup due to the existing truck lease.
- o In the short term, additional regular garbage cans can be placed curbside.
- Transition to a mechanized truck is expected in the fall, after which only the designated cans will be accepted.

IX. MOTIONS

Draft Audit Approval

The draft audit for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, was reviewed. Motion made by Mr. Wiseman and seconded by Mr. Kowaliwskyj and was approved unanimously.

• Compliance Committee

Nancy Volk from the Compliance Committee reminded attendees of the no-no's and the new rule prohibiting plants around mailboxes, allowing only hardscape.

Activities Committee

Linda Murray from the Activities Committee announced upcoming events, including a food truck event on May 16, 2025, and the return of the Mr. Softy truck.

XI. UPDATES (N/A)

XII. ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Passman MOTIONED to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Wiseman SECONDED. None Opposed. MOTION CARRIED.

The Meeting was adjourned at 7:20 PM.

XIII. OPEN FORUM

- Regina Van Dyke-- 47 Greenwich Avenue. Regarding House Fire Ruins
 - A resident inquired about the removal of ruins from a house fire.
 - The association is waiting on the insurance company to act, similar to situations with vacant homes.
- Zorine lesals—39 Leighton Lane. Signage Location
 - o Concern was raised about the placement of the "God Bless America" sign near a lake path, which is not easily accessible for all residents.
 - She suggested to relocate the sign to a more visible and accessible area.
 - The sign's spotlight is on from 7 PM to 7 AM, causing disturbance to nearby residents.
 - The board explained that with the new veteran's memorial the sign was initially intended to be removed and disposed of and replaced with a memorial but has been retained and relocated. Its current location was chosen for visibility from various community spots.
 - o The board is open to adjusting the spotlight hours.
- Maryann Saponara—39 Twyford—Painting the top of new garbage cans
 - Resident does not like the yellow color of the top of the new garbage cans and asked if she can paint it a different color.
 - o The board explained no residents cannot. Pete explained that the colors were chosen by the collection company, and we did not have input into that decision. The colors are generally chosen for visibility for the collectors and are identified with a particular collection company.

Meeting concluded at 7:31 PM.

The swimming pool is for the enjoyment of the residents and their guests. Gate Attendants at the pool are to control admittance and to assist in enforcement of Pool Rules & Regulations.

NOTE: Gate Attendants and Lifeguards have no authority to grant exceptions to any rule.

The Pool Rules are delivered to all residents before the Pool Season. They are also posted at the pool during the swimming Season. In 2018, the State of New Jersey adopted a new Sanitary Code Chapter IX for Public Recreational Bathing and the Association is required to comply with these codes, in addition to setting up their own rules and regulations.

The complete rules are available at the Gate Attendant's table and posted at the Pump House.

The State-mandated rules are printed in bold letters and italicized within the Association's Swimming Pool Rules & Regulations and are also posted on a Notice Board at the pool.

A. POOL HOURS

- 1. Pool hours are 10:00 AM to 8:00 P.M. or dusk, whichever comes first, each swimming season and are posted at the pool.
- 2. Guests of Residents' ages four (4) years through fifteen (15) years may utilize the pool and pool area Monday Friday from 11 AM to 1 PM and 4 PM to 6 PM and Saturdays from 4 PM to 6 PM except on holidays and during hours of organized exercise (which will be posted). Guests must be accompanied by a Resident.
- 3. Guests of Residents' ages sixteen (16) years and over may utilize the pool and pool area during all hours of operation and must be accompanied by a Resident.
- 4. Lifeguards must be present or the pool will be closed to guests fifteen (15) and under.
- 5. Lifeguards are instructed to close the pool during a threat of inclement weather.

B. ELIGIBILITY

All Leisure Knoll Residents in good standing and their invited Guests are eligible to use the pool with the following restrictions:

- 1. Residents and Guests must have updated, official Leisure Knoll badges.
- 2. Residents and Guests must be sixteen (16) years and older and are allowed within the pool gates during all pool hours.
- 3. Children who are four (4) years of age or older and who are completely toilet-trained are permitted in the pool or within the pool area. An adult must accompany a non-swimming child or any child under the age of seven (7) in the water.
- 4. Children under four (4) years of age and babies in arms or strollers shall not be permitted within the pool gated area.

C. ADMITTANCE TO THE POOL

- 1. Each Resident and Guest (adult or child) must show an updated, official Leisure Knoll badge to the Gate Attendant <u>and sign in.</u>
- 2. No more than four (4) Guests are permitted from any one household. All Guests must have badges with the accompanying Residents' address. Guest badges may be purchased at the Association Office during regular business hours.
- 3. NO GUESTS ARE PERMITTED IN POOL AREA WITHOUT RESIDENT.

D. USE OF THE POOL

- Any person showing evidence of any communicable skin disease, sore or inflamed eyes, cold, nasal or ear discharges, or any other communicable diseases shall be denied admission.
- 2. Any person with excessive sunburn, open blisters, cuts or bandages shall be denied admission.
- 3. Do not enter the water if you are experiencing or recovering from -diarrhea or have had any signs or symptoms or gastrointestinal (stomach) disease in the past seven (7) days.
- 4. Neither cloth nor disposable diapers are permitted in the pool. Diapers specifically designed for immersion in water are acceptable such as "Healthtex" Reusables" and/or "Huggies Little Swimmers" Disposables
- 5. Children should be encouraged to use the restroom before entering the water. Immediately report any accidents you observe in the bathing waters to a lifeguard.
- 6. No animals are permitted in the pool or on the pool deck, except for service animals which shall be allowed on the pool deck.
- 7. All persons shall shower before entering the water.
- 8. Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others shall be prohibited.
- 9. Outdoor bathing shall be prohibited during an electrical storm.
- 10. Persons suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall be prohibited from entering the water and must leave the pool area.
- 11. An adult must accompany a non-swimming child or any child under the age of seven (7) in the water.
- 12. All injuries must be reported to the Lifeguard and/or Gate Attendant immediately.
- 13. Only proper swimming attire is acceptable for the pool. Absolutely no cutoffs are permitted. NO ONE PERMITTED IN POOL WITH STREET CLOTHES.
- 14. All persons wearing wet bathing suits and wishing to use the Clubhouse must use the REAR entrance/exit for restrooms. Children must be accompanied by an adult when using these facilities. No one is permitted to walk through the Clubhouses in wet bathing suits. All pool users should park in the rear parking lot across from the Maintenance Building.
- 15. Food is not permitted in the pool enclosure. Designated areas are located in several locations outside of the pool enclosure for dining. Beverages are permitted only in unbreakable containers. Glass containers of any kind are prohibited. No alcohol is permitted. Any person found drinking alcohol at the pool must leave the pool area immediately.
- 16. Gum chewing is not permitted in the pool area.
- 17. No running, playing tag, rough and rowdy play, water pistols, water guns or other squirting devices, or blaring radios will be permitted in the pool area or on the pool deck.
- 18. Ball playing is not permitted.
- 19. Jumping/diving/cannonballing and the like into the pool and/or racing in the pool are prohibited.
- 20. Rafts, hammocks floats, large/oversized chair floats, snorkels, and masks are not permitted in the pool. "Noodles", small "Noodle" chairs and small float chairs will be permitted. Noodles may be no larger than 5'L x 3"C and Noodle Chairs and Float Chairs may be no larger than 32"W x 25"D x 6"C. If too many of the aforementioned permitted items are present, at any point in time, and based upon bather load, they may be prohibited by the Lifeguard. *Lifebelts which are fastened around the body or arms are permissible.* All devices must be approved by the Lifeguard.

- 21. Lawn chairs may be brought from home but must be of a size/type similar in nature to the pool chairs in use by the Association. Use of additional chairs will be limited by deck capacity.
- 22. POOL LADDERS/STAIRS ARE FOR ENTRY/EXIT TO THE POOL ONLY AND MUST NOT BE BLOCKED.
- 23. Incontinent adults must wear swim suit diapers or snug plastic pants under their swim suits. These must be tightly fitted around the waist and legs in order to contain any matter in the event of an accident. Examples of acceptable garments for adults: "Swimsters Reusables" and/or "SwimMates Disposables".
- 24. The Association or its designated representative shall be the sole judge as to the adequacy of protective swimwear or other protective garment.
- 25. OFFENSIVE LANGUAGE (PROFANITY) WILL RESULT IN BEING ASKED TO LEAVE THE POOL/POOL DECK.
- 26. Bathers will yield to swimmers in the lap lane.
- 27. Entry stairs/ladders must be kept free and clear at all times. No sitting or loitering permitted.
- 28. For assistance with using the ADA Chair Lift, please see the Gate Attendant.

E. RESPONSIBILITY

- 1. All Residents and their Guests, including children, using the pool facilities do so at their own risk. The Association will not be responsible for any accidents in connection with such use.
- 2. Members and/or Guests will be responsible for the cost of any damages caused through their negligence and/or carelessness.
- 3. The Association will not be responsible for loss of jewelry, valuables, clothing, or property in or about the pool. Any and all belongings left behind will be discarded daily.
- 4. No chairs, tables or lounges can be reserved. Every Resident has an equal right to their use. On weekends and holidays, Residents and their Guests are encouraged to bring their own seating.
- 5. When the pool deck is crowded, personal belongings must be removed from extra chairs to allow others to use these chairs.
- 6. No smoking or vaping is permitted in the pool, on the pool deck, or at the entrance apron to the pool deck.

THESE RULES HAVE BEEN ESTABLISHED ON THE BASIS OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY SANITARY CODE CHAPTER IX FOR PUBLIC RECREATIONAL BATHING AND ON PAST EXPERIENCE AND HAVE BEEN DESIGNED FOR THE COMMON GOOD OF RESIDENTS AND THEIR GUESTS.

EVERY RESIDENT SHOULD BE FAMILIAR WITH AND ABIDE BY THESE RULES.

ANY RESIDENT OR GUEST WHO VIOLATES THESE RULES FORFEITS HIS OR HER RIGHT TO REMAIN IN THE POOL AREA.

LACK OF COOPERATION WILL RESULT IN THE POOL BEING CLOSED
UNTIL THE VIOLATORS LEAVE THE POOL AREA.
THE LIFEGUARD MAKES THE FINAL DETERMINATION ON ALL SAFETY ISSUES.



Notice of Meeting and Call for Nominations for Board of Trustees

During the month of September, our village will hold elections for the Board of Trustees. There are two, three-year terms open at this time. This is the formal notice of meeting and a call for nominations. All members in good standing may nominate themselves or other members in good standing for election to the Board. All nominations with supporting documents should be submitted to the Association office no later than 4:00 P.M. on Friday, June 13, 2025.

Article V, Section 5, a, b and c of the By-Laws detail the requirements as follows:

- A. If an Association Member is currently serving as a Trustee, they shall be deemed to have nominated themself for reelection by stating their intention to seek reelection in writing addressed to the Board of Trustees.
- B. If an Association Member who is not currently serving as a Trustee desires to nominate themself to run for the Board, they shall file with the Board of Trustees a written statement signifying their intention to seek election together with a resume addressing their vision for the Knoll.
- C. Nominated candidates will have their names printed on the ballot in alphabetical order. There will also be write-in lines equal to the number of seats up for election.

The Voting Committee will verify the eligibility of the nominated candidates to run for election. The names of all candidates will be announced at the Board of Trustees meeting taking place July 9, 2025. The Community Channel 1970 and the website at www.leisureknoll.net will announce the names of the verified candidates immediately thereafter.

Within fourteen (14) days after verification, the candidates for the Board shall meet with the Secretary of the Board of Trustees and the Trustee Liaison and Chairperson of the Voting Committee to review the Rules and Regulations pertaining to the Election of Trustees. At this meeting, the name or names of observers should be submitted. A maximum of two (2) observers per candidate shall be allowed.

Candidates may distribute election materials to the members of the Association but may not leave them at homes without giving them directly to the resident. The candidates' resumes and vision statements will be published in the August and the September issues of the Knoll News.

Traditionally, a Candidates' Night is scheduled in the PAC during the month of August for each candidate to address the members. This meeting's format is at the discretion of the Board of Trustees.

Should anything in this notice be found to conflict with the Rules and Regulations and Amended and Restated Bylaws, those latter documents govern. New Jersey Laws and Regulations in effect prior to the date of the election will take precedence over the aforementioned Association documents.







May greetings from the Ren Selvaggio Cookie Jar volunteers. After a cold, but relatively snow-free January and February, in blew a very confused March. You know, the month when we all ride the daily "What-Season-Is-It Today and how should I dress merry-go-round." I'm not making that seasonal closet switch any time soon — nope — not me. I'm waiting until Mother Naure gets back on her meds, drinks a glass of wine, and starts thinking warm happy thoughts! April showers, however, appeared right on time and that's OK!

It's been a while since I've written about the origin of the Ren Selvaggio Cookie Jar. On the 22nd of April each year, we celebrate Earth Day to commemorate the 1970 birth of the modern environmental movement. Because it encourages the daily recycling of paper and cardboard, The Ren Selvaggio Cookie Jar project is very much a part of this effort. Ren Selvaggio was a Leisure Knoll resident who, before his passing in 2019, had a 28-year commitment to enhancing and improving our LK Community's recycling program. Please continue reading to learn more about how you can contribute to our recycling efforts.

Instead of placing your cardboard, newspaper, magazines, and books out for pickup every other Monday, bring them down to the two Cookie Jar trailers located adjacent to the maintenance building/overflow parking lot. When the trailer is full, arrangements are made for it to be carted away and weighed. The monies received are returned to our community by donations made to the many Leisure Knoll clubs and events.

Ren Selvaggio Cookie Jar's Six-Step, Recycling-For-Success Program

- Collect all your cardboard DO NOT tie it up Tied cardboard must be untied to insure proper stacking. Absolutely NO Pizza Boxes – the oily residue that remains on the top and bottom makes cardboard unacceptable for recycling.
- Collect your newspapers and magazines DO tie them up.
- Collect your books DO NOT tie them up.
- Take only your cardboard/paper (no glass, plastic or Styrofoam) to the two Cookie Jar trailers by the maintenance building/overflow parking lot.



HAM SALAD (Using up leftover Easter Ham)

Submitted by Patrice Neumann

Not sure what to do with that leftover ham from Easter? Try this quick recipe to use in a sandwich or hollowed-out bread loaf as an appetizer.

Ingredients:

- ½ cup mayonnaise (use more if needed)
- 2 tablespoons whole-grain mustard
- 1 pound leftover baked ham, cut into 1-inch chunks (or buy a ham slice from the meat section of your favorite supermarket)
- 1 ¼ cups drained bread and butter pickle chips and 1 tablespoon pickle juice
- 2 ribs of celery, finely chopped plus 2 tablespoons coarsely chopped leaves (from inner ribs if possible)
- ½ small red onion, finely chopped

Directions:

- Whisk the mayo and mustard together in a large bowl
- Pulse the ham and pickles in a food processor until finely chopped (not pureed)
- Add the ham mixture, pickle juice, celery, onions and celery leaves to mayo mixture and stir
- Taste the salad and add more mayo or pickle juice if the salad seems dry

Note: I find that baked ham that has then been frozen can be watery upon thawing, so start with less mayo/pickle juice and add as needed.
