FRANCES PERKINS AND THE BIRTH OF SOCIAL SECURITY

Ninety years ago next month, President Roosevelt signed the Social Security Act. This was no quick fix to the problem of the elderly poor. Payroll tax collection began in 1937, and the first monthly benefit wasn't paid until 1940. For Frances Perkins, FDR's Secretary of Labor, passage of the Social Security Act was a personal victory among many accomplishments that improved the lives of American workers. For 85 years, the general framework of Social Security has remained the same (benefits are paid only from payroll taxes paid by employee and employer), although adjustments to benefits and tax rates have been made periodically.

Frances Perkins is the subject of Stephanie Dray's book, <u>Becoming Madam Secretary</u>. The book is a fictionalized biography of the first woman to hold a Cabinet position. Frances had a privileged upbringing in Massachusetts. Her education at Mt. Holyoke (Class of 1902) introduced her to the Progressive Movement and the difficult lives of the poor. Her conservative family believed that the poor were responsible for their own problems, but Frances no longer shared that view. She set off for New York City to make a difference in the lives of those who needed help.

Frances joined a group of other young women who shared her interests. Mary Harriman, a railroad heiress, became a lifelong friend and supported her ideas both financially and practically. (A fun fact: Mary Harriman founded the Junior League, originally known as the Junior League for the Promotion of Settlement Movements). After witnessing the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory fire in 1911, she committed herself to a lifetime of acting for social reform. Another activist, Florence Kelley, sent Frances to lobby in Albany for the Progressive agenda. She developed a talent for negotiating with legislators who had rarely if ever seen a woman in their chambers. Gov. Al Smith was sympathetic to her views and installed her as Chair of the Industrial Board to deal with labor issues in New York. She remained in Albany to work in FDR's administration, and he invited her to join his Presidential Cabinet as Secretary of Labor.

This book could have been a dry recitation of Frances's accomplishments, but it wisely spends more time on the development of her relationships with Al Smith and FDR. She was single-minded in her dedication to passing laws limiting working hours, especially for children, establishing a Federal minimum wage, and providing a retirement income for the elderly. Both men supported her goals and appreciated her dealmaking ability. She saw FDR grows from a political lightweight to, as a polio survivor, a compassionate leader truly interested in improving the lives of Depression-era Americans.

Ms. Dray deals sensitively with Frances's unhappy personal life. She married happily but her husband developed symptoms of bipolar disorder shortly after the birth of their daughter. He was hospitalized for much of his life and Frances was the sole support of her family. She was estranged from her daughter but reconciled in later years. Ms. Dray has a sympathetic attitude of "Well, look at all she accomplished. It's understandable that she wasn't Mother of the Year". She also treats Frances's rumored romantic relationship with Mary Harriman fairly. Mary provided a home for Frances in her Georgetown townhouse, and the two were undoubtedly close with a shared interest in social reform. Ms. Dray concludes that a romantic relationship is not impossible but unlikely, not least because Frances was devoutly religious and would disapprove of any extramarital affairs.

As Secretary of Labor, Frances advanced several "Social Safety Net" issues in addition to Social Security. The book follows her efforts in getting the legislative support she needed (always the persistent lobbyist) and manages to create some suspense although we know that she succeeded. She was the chair of the President's Committee on Social Insurance, which drafted the legislation. The insurance concept was important because the drafters of the legislation believed that if the plan depended on government funds Congress could terminate it at any time. An insurance plan, on the other hand, would be funded by employee (and employer) contributions, all participants would receive benefits (with lower-paid workers receiving a proportionally higher percentage of their contributions), and future Congresses would have a difficult time weakening or ending the program.

This is a good book for people who enjoy historical fiction, especially about accomplished women who are not household names. Although the Roaring Twenties seems to have taken place without much participation by Frances Perkins, we do see Frances's social life in New York, with tea dances, the opera, and dinners with Sinclair Lewis and friends.

If you are a Social Security beneficiary, say "Thank you" to Frances Perkins and "Happy Birthday" to Social Security!

STAFF SPOTLIGHT ON ROB HIRZEL, ASSISTANT GOLF PRO

From a young man whose golf balls would ricochet loudly off the pine trees lining the narrow fairways at Forge Pond golf course, Rob Hirzel has refined his game to the point that he can fade and draw that dimpled sphere, at will, avoiding hazards, and curving his shots to match the contours of the hole, so that it settles safely in the coveted

short grass. He has now advanced to the final level of preparation to achieve PGA Professional status.

Growing up in Brick, Rob didn't pay much attention to golf. Rob's grandfather, father and older brother all played the game, but Rob's interests were elsewhere. Tall and athletic, his main sport was basketball at Brick Memorial High School. He also loved his dogs and fishing. It wasn't until he finished high school that his brother introduced him to golf and the challenges of the par-60 executive course at Forge Pond. It was later that Rob first played a regulation course, Lakewood Country Club, where is grandfather worked after retirement. Rob parred the 2nd hole. He then became "addicted to golf."

After high school, Rob continued his education at Ocean County College, majoring in criminal justice. He then landed a position in campus security at New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT), continuing his education while there, and eventually being promoted to dispatcher. But the golf bug had bit him. Rob and his brother both had Mondays off, so they played together every chance they could. So driven to improve, Rob would work loads of overtime, and take Paid Time Off in lieu of the money, so that he could have Sunday, Monday and Tuesday to play golf. Rob said, "If I wasn't working, I was playing golf."

Rob credits his older brother for introducing him to the game of golf and being his constant playing partner. He credits his father, who was a very good player, for helping him improve his swing and game. But his most significant golf developments came when he joined Fairway Mews and teamed up with FM Golf Pro Dan O'Malley.

While at NJIT, Rob responded to an on-line ad for an entry-level assistant at the Fairway Mews golf course. He didn't know Fairway Mews even existed. Rob applied because he knew he "wanted to be around golf," not behind a police dispatcher's desk. He got the job. In his 2nd year at FM, Dan O'Malley became the new Head Pro. That's when Rob's education in the business of golf really began. Dan taught Rob about the golf industry: how to run a tournament; build relationships with vendors; order appropriate merchandise; give lessons. In his first year at FM, Rob didn't teach at all. Dan stressed, "if you're going to work in the golf business, you need to give lessons." He also emphasized to Rob the importance of customizing his teaching methods to the different skill levels of his students. You need a different approach for a 70 or 80-year-old with physical limitations than for a limber 16-year-old, who plays every day, swings hard, and wants to be captain of his or her high school team. It excites Rob to teach people who are motivated to get better. He also believes that giving lessons improves his own game.

Dan has also been instrumental in the improvement of Rob's own golf game and his advancement toward becoming a PGA professional. Rob qualified to enter the PGA program by shooting a first round 75 at the PGA qualifier at Mattawang Country Club in Belle Mead, in tem-peratures over 100 degrees, wearing the PGA-required long pants. Since then, he has completed the first two levels of PGA course work in Golf Operations and has just entered the final level. Rob will travel to Texas as part of that program and the expansion of his golf portfolio.

According to Rob, from "day 1, Dan helped me with my golf game," and he still does. Rob explained that Dan was not only part of a great collegiate golf program, he learned from leading golf pros at the clubs where he worked in Florida and New Jersey. Rob lauds Dan for his will-ingness to share that knowledge and his own golf skills to make Rob both a better golfer and golf industry professional. During FM's off season, Rob plays a lot of golf in the Carolinas. When he returns, he has his "annual check-up with Dan" to review his mechanics. Dan "sees right away" if something is off. Rob says that Dan O'Malley "changed my golf game."

Besides completing his PGA professional course work, Rob hopes to play in more PGA-run tournaments this year. I asked Rob how FM members could make his job easier. The answer was not surprising. It applies to every golf course. "Be on time." As he and Dan say: "Hate Late." It impacts every other golfer behind you, as well as the pairings for league play and tournaments. That was my golf lesson for the day.

To me, Rob Hirzel exudes a sense of inner joy. I think it comes from his realization that he has found that very sweet spot in life: a career-path that brings both personal satisfaction and the opportunity to enhance the lives of others. We all should be so fortunate.

SL'S THUNDER ROAD BOOKS REOPENS IN EXPANDED SPACE

Thunder Road Books, Spring Lake's independent bookstore, has reopened in its new, expanded location at the corner of 3rd and Passaic Avenues, the former home of Kate & Co. In fact, the two businesses swapped locations earlier this year.

Thunder Road (TRB) completely renovated the space, taking it down to the original, hundred-year-old hardwood floors. It created cozy reading areas with colorful rugs and plush arm chairs that face a wall of southern exposure windows offering expansive views of the trees and waters of Spring Lake. It silently harkens you to settle in with a new book and your tea or coffee.

In the rear of the shop, an expanded children's section is lined with peaked bookcases that, for me, resemble narrow, Dutch houses. There is now enough floor space for children (and their parents) to gather comfortably for a weekly story hour. "Story Time" is held every Wednesday at 10 a.m. Kate Czyzewski, TBR's Manager and Event Coordinator, is most excited by the opportunity she has been given to introduce children to reading at any early age. This former kindergarten teacher's passion for children and the importance of reading is palpable. She says it comes from her grandmother, a teacher and avid reader. Kate told me, "I feel her presence here."

TBR collaborates with the Spring Lake and Sea Girt libraries so that their respective children's story times are held on different days. Often, the same families attend all three. Thunder Road has already seen its Story Time attendance increase to 25. It may be event for Fairway Mews' residents to consider for their children and grandchildren, particularly on a non-beach day. [No reservation is required].

Monthly Book Club: The store hosts a Fiction Book Group the 3rd Wednesday of every month at 7 p.m. Each month's selection can be found on its website. During the four-month hiatus between the closing of the original

location and the reopening in late May, other Spring Lake businesses rallied in support of TRB. Sun and Waves, at the corner of 3rd and Washington, opened its doors and kitchen as the substitute home for TRB's monthly Fiction Book Group. Barefoot Athleisure Boutique created weekend space amid its clothing apparel for some TRB book sales. Author Events: In less than four years of existence, Thunder Road Books has become a "place to be" for authors. When the store opened in 2021, Kate and TRB had to submit written proposals to publishing companies entreating them to agree to an author's appearance. Fiona Davis, best- selling author of historical fiction, took a chance on Kate and TBR in year-one and the event sold out. The two have become close friends and Ms. Davis has since made return appearances to Spring Lake. Renowned author Mitch Albom also appeared in that first year. Bestselling thriller and suspense novelist James Patterson has come to Spring Lake on multiple occasions, and this year he asked Kate if he could come again. She said, "Yes." He will appear with author Mike Lupica on July 27, 2025. (See: Community Bulletin Board for list of July Author Events). Now, authors submit application to Thunder Road Books requesting to appear. James Patterson and Kate have become such good friends that she is one of the subjects in his non-fiction book, The Secret Lives of Booksellers and Librarians.



The establishment of Thunder Road Books in Spring Lake was the vision of owner Basil Iwanyk, a New Jersey native. Basil, a very successful movie producer in Los Angeles, under the banner Thunder Road Films, is, needless to say, a huge Bruce Springsteen fan. He is also a fan of Spring Lake and this area. So much so that he has since moved with his wife and family back here. To implement his vision, Basil needed a special person. He found it in Kate Czyzewski. Remarkably, the two had never met. Basil found this Howell, NJ kindergarten teacher through word of mouth and her book blog called *The Salty Bookworm*. Since Kate had a secure teaching job and had no experience running a bookstore, she was flattered, but not interested. Obviously, minds change. Kate decided to take the leap because she and Basil shared the love of storytelling, and she was moved by his desire to establish a bookstore and sense of community in Spring Lake, and by the opportunity it presented to her to introduce more children to reading. The match has sparked a flame.

There are dozens of author events scheduled for this summer at Thunder Road Books. A number of them will be held at the Spring Lake Community Center because of seating capacity. **FAIR WARNING**, many of these events sell out, so check the website if you are interested. www.thunderroadbooks.com. One can also follow them on Facebook and Instagram. So, if there is a book that you would like to read, don't click on Amazon; support your community's local, independent bookstore. If it's not on TRB's shelf, they will quickly order it for you.

Thunder Road Books is open seven (7) days a week starting at 10 a.m.

Sudoku requires no calculation or arithmetic skills. It is essentially a game of placing numbers in squares, using very simple rules of logic and deduction.

The objective of the game is to fill all the blank squares in a game with the correct numbers. There are three very simple constraints to follow. In a 9 by 9 square Sudoku game:

- Every row of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every column of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every 3 by 3 subsection of the 9 by 9 square must include all digits 1 through 9

Every Sudoku games begins with a number of squares already filled in, and the difficulty of each game is largely a function of how many squares are filled in. The more squares that are known, the easier it is to figure out which numbers go in the open squares. As you fill in squares correctly, options for the remaining squares are narrowed and it becomes easier to fill them in.
