





MOTHER'S DAY

Honoring mothers and motherhood is a custom celebrated around the world, and one that dates back to ancient Greece and Rome, with festivals for the mother goddesses, Rhea and Cybele. In the US, we celebrate Mother's Day on the second Sunday of May, and this tradition has its own origin story. The clearest precursor to



the holiday we celebrate today is Mothering Sunday, an early Christian festival popular in the United Kingdom and Europe.

But the path to what we now know as Mother's Day includes some twists and turns, including regret and an attempted reversal by the founder of the official holiday. These days, we often don't reflect on the history of Mother's Day and its evolution over the years. Busy lives mean it can be tough to find the time to just plan for the big day. This is a bit ironic in the case of Mother's Day, whose focus has seen some drastic changes in its history.

The creation of Mother's Day is attributed to three women: Julia Ward Howe and Ann Reeves Jarvis, both community activists who founded the day for community engagement and mutual aid, and the daughter of Ann Reeves Jarvis, Anna M. Jarvis, who campaigned to make Mother's Day an official holiday to memorialize her mother's achievements in service and honor all mothers.

SALVATORE RAYMOND "SONNY" LA BIANCA



Salvatore Raymond "Sonny" La Bianca, 87, passed away on March 21, 2025, in Manahawkin, New Jersey. Born on March 14, 1938, in the Bronx, New York, Sonny lived a life defined by dedication to family, service to his community, and an unwavering commitment to his values. Sonny

attended P.S. 127 in the Bronx before pursuing further training with the NYC Bricklayers Union and later the NYPD Police Academy. His career as a Transit Police Officer with the NYPD was marked by bravery and distinction. Officer La Bianca, shield #2498, received several commendations for his service, including the Police Combat Cross, Meritorious Police Duty award, and the Purple Shield. His career was cut short in 1971 due to injuries sustained during the Black Panther/ Earth Day riots on April 22, 1970. Despite this early retirement from law enforcement, Sonny remained a steadfast figure of strength and resilience.

Music was another of Sonny's many talents; as a young man, he performed in talent shows and embraced music as a creative outlet throughout his life. Above all else, he cherished his role as a husband and father. Alongside his beloved wife Joan-his partner of 68 years-he raised three sons with strong values of respect, loyalty, and honor.

Sonny is survived by his devoted wife Joan; sons Robert (Pamela) and John (Lori) La Bianca; brotherin-law Arthur Schmitt; sister-in law Jean La Bianca. Grandchildren Thomas, Michael, Anthony, Timothy, Jennifer, Krista, Olivia, Emily, Abigail, Ruby La Bianca and Amanda Pratt. He was preceded in death by his son Joseph; parents Giuseppe and Dorothea; parents-in-law Arthur and Josephine (Burke) Schmitt: sisters Francine (Joseph) Casio and Rosaria (Anthony) Rumore; brothers Joseph (Carol), Mario (Gloria), and Victor Carmine La Bianca; and sister-in-law Nancy Schmitt.

Sonny worshipped at St. Dominic's Catholic Church in the Bronx. He carried strong family values throughout his life and remained a steadfast presence for those who needed him most. His work ethic was unmatched-at times working three jobs early in his marriage to provide for those he loved.

Sonny's legacy is one of strength, devotion, and integrity-a life well-lived that will be remembered by all who knew him. May he rest in peace.



SENIOR ADVISORY MEETING

I attended the Senior Advisory Meeting held on March 31st, at the Mystic Shores Clubhouse.

Guest Speaker #1 was Little Egg Harbor Police Chief Jim Hawkins, told us about their 1st Citizen Police Academy, an 8-week course.

Problem with cars being broken into, please lock your car doors as they are going around checking for open car door handles, don't leave valuables, key fobs, and close your garage doors.

Fraud is still a big problem among seniors, receiving calls that a grandchild is in trouble, and you need to send money to resolve the problem.... BIG SCAM DON'T DO IT!!!!

2nd Guest Speaker was Assemblymen Brain Rumpf.

Number one issue right now in NJ are the Utility Bills everyone receives, enhancing solar and windmill usage.

We created more energy in the past. but Governor eliminated other sources of energy, so now we depend on other states. There is a bill to certify nuclear reactors grid in Lacey Township to help with our utility bills, not enough supply to meet the demand of the public.

He serves on the State Budget Committee \$58.05 Billion which fully funds the States Pensions, but local school budgets have been cut. They are trying to bring schools within budget as there is too much over run spending. He serves on the States Military Veterans Committee and said NJ needs to do more for its veterans. A bill is pending to give disabled veterans not receiving 100% disability, a corresponding amount of their disability to offset taxes,

Senior Freeze and Anchor programs will happen if- 1-Fully Funded Education, 2-Fully Funded Pensions, 3-Amount of Surplus currently 11%.

Was asked how the cuts on the Federal level will affect the State budget programs he was unsure of that issue. How will the state handle emergencies if FEMA is done away with as was much needed when Sandy hits the shore area, again too early to know. 3rd Guest Speaker was Dana from the LEH Tax Collection Office, spoke about the PAS Booklets P-Property Freeze, A-Anchor, S-State of NJ. They are going to be holding a learning session on Wednesdays 1-3pm at the Town Hall for those having trouble filling out the booklets,
